Marion L Evans of Middletown, DE passed away peacefully at home on Monday March 16, 2026) at the age of 87, with her children at her side.

She listened to this cd every night when she went to bed. Mom loved all aspects of life. She mostly loved the time she spent with her family. Her children, sisters, cousins, nieces and nephews. More joyful times spent with her 5 grandchildren IVOREE, Amber, Jade, Jordan and Maya and her 4 great grandchildren Taylor, Onyx, Obsidian and Madison.

Marion also enjoyed sewing. Creating and making her window treatments. She also did alterations for others including Ethel DuPont. Mom had a love for life and she demonstrated that every day. She was blessed and highly favored. She was given strength and courage to walk tall and strong in difficult times. She was stylish, classy and a sophisticated lady.
